


breeze. Plus, I have a coffee machine for those early risers.


High Hopes for a Successful **Summer!**

You may also notice this year down in racquets, a few large black circular devices! These are what are referred to as "near field communication devices." By simply tapping your phone to the device you can receive up to date dynamic content for all things pickleball and tennis! Try it out if you see one on campus!


I have a number of Babolat and Paddletek's for demo in the pro shop. If you love one we can have it for you in a matter of days.
